Hello, my name is Tom Whitfield. I'm from Lewisham + Greenwich, and I'm running for Shadow MEST-UP coordinator. At V camp, I saw how the MEST-UP centre faced a lot of problems with finding enough volunteers.

The programme is supposed to be run by DFs, but some of the people working the nightshifts were kinsfolk. This is not because DFs are lazy, but because a surprising number of them are just not MEST-UP trained. At

Winter Wonderland 2025, the biggest event of the year, nobody ran training. If this continues, the DFs who are MEST-UP trained and work shifts and run activities, either on events or big camps, will age out, with no one to continue their legacy, causing the programme, which has been an integral aspect of DFs for years, to eventually die out. I'm still 17, so I have a good few more years in DFs. Some of the most fun I've had during my 11 years in Woodcraft has been at DF events, but when I've been there I've seen a lot of people, and sometimes been one of them myself, who have needed help with something that a steward or first aider is not equipped for. If MEST-UP continues on its current downward trajectory, there will be nobody at events with the necessary training to administer this kind of support. I will make sure that MEST-UP training is run every Winter Wonderland, as that many DFs in one place is a prime opportunity to grow the movement. Vote for me, and I will work with the MEST-UP coordinator to ensure that this programme remains an important part of DFs that rather than being held up by a few key members, is contributed to by every DF.
